
for two or many voices

Pass the Music, a Round

The first and second lines are rounds independent of each other, though sharing tempo.

An easy round scheme is for one voice to begin, then subsequent voices enter at the measure. Line one may be repeated many times, and that's that.

Or, line one, after being repeated a number of times, may lead to line two, which is then repeated many times, and that's that.

Since propagation is the subject, it's worth finding out what would happen if entrances are moved closer together than one measure apart.
