17 Assignments for Amy Charlotte Benson

- 1. Write a haiku, limerick, or sestina called "A History of New York City."
- 2. Write a short story, use only nouns and prepositions (e.g., "Mice on wheels. Teeth thru cheese. Time for Ingrid!").
- 3. Write a story in the second person plural voice.
- 4. Argue, in front of the class, convincingly, that "The Lottery," or "To Build a Fire," is the greatest story ever written (or the worst).
- 5. Write a poem that makes one specific person in the class angry (sad, insulted, uneasy, scared....).
- 6. Write a story in the voice and about the experience of someone much less fortunate than you, more victimized, less powerful.
- 7. Write a poem consisting entirely of specific complaints about your life, your situation.
- 8. Sing #7.
- 9. Using only a dictionary, translate a poem from a language you don't understand into English. Next, translate that back into the original language (or some other language), again, using only a dictionary.
- 10. Write a critical essay about a well-known short story, poem, or novel. Use the word "beets" as many times as you can.
- 11. Write a piece of non-fiction that begins "Dear grandma" and ends "Skip and Peanut are on their way home now."
- 12. Write a story where all sentences are made of a prime number of words (or powers of two).
- 13. Write a poem, which is just the words of another poem, rearranged. Or, in which every other word is from another poem (in order). Or, which is a word-by-word rewriting of another poem, but in your own words.
- 14. Prepare a list of the "10 Greatest Novels of all Time" (or poems, or plays, or stories). a) Nobody else should have heard of any of these, or, b) Make them up.

- 15. Give the following assignment: Write a poem about your cat, or any other pet. If you don't have a pet, write about a relative's pet. Your entire grade will be based on this assignment.
- 16. Write a poem or story, imitating as closely as you can, the style of another author, who doesn't exist.
- 17. Write something which is not a [poem, story, recipe, novel, essay, set of directions, list, play, score, lecture, email, letter, eulogy,], or anything else that has a name.
